Document 2 'Meat - the Facts'. www.dalesnet.co.uk

Document 3 Man-eating lions cartoon. www.vegetus.org

In this section you will be given marks for:

- identifying accurately, and comparing, the lines of reasoning and main points from the documents
- synthesising the key information in a form that is relevant to the purpose

1 List **two** points on which the writers of documents 1 and 2 agree and **two** points on which they disagree. In your own words, consider the extent to which document 1 supports the views put forward in document 2.

2 Select **three** ideas in document 1 and explain how these could be supported by document 3. In your opinion, how successful is the cartoon in addressing the animal rights issues raised in document 1?

3 Both document 1 and document 3 contain humour. Identify **three** ways in which the writer of document 1 creates humour, giving an example of each. Consider the writer's **and** cartoonist's purposes in using humour and assess how effective you think they are.

- organising the relevant information from all three documents clearly and coherently
- using your own words and specialist vocabulary where appropriate
- writing legibly using accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar
